

The Greene County Electoral Board met March 2, 2021 at 10:15 a.m. at the Registrar's Annex in Stanardsville, VA.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Deane.

All members and the Registrar watched the live announcement of the Virginia 2020 election risk assessment audit, which established that, based on a random sample of Virginia voting precincts, the results of the election were valid to within less than one percentage point of possible error. The official results can be found at www.elections.virginia.gov.

The minutes from February 22 were reviewed and approved. Upcoming Security details were discussed following the release of guidelines and directions from the VR Supporting Technologies Security Plan and other forms requiring the review of Greene County electoral practices. Most of the online and offline Registrar's office is a part of and managed by the County IT.

The Electoral Board and the Registrar will meet on March 16 to proceed with the security audit. They will complete the process by March 31, 2021.

There will be a Democratic Primary June 8, 2021, with early voting at the Registrar's Annex beginning April 23. The Republican party will hold a convention.

The Electoral Board will ensure that all voting machines are tested and validated for the June 8, 2021 Democratic Primary. Officers of election will be trained in late May/early June for the election.


The November election this year will include local elections for county officers. The Board approved use of the Registrar's Annex for local firehouse primary elections if requested by either or both parties.

The next meeting for the security review, was set for 9:30 a.m. on March 16, 2021.


There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 12:15 p.m.
