RE: PUBLIC MEETING

The Chairman opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance followed by a moment of silence.

RE: ARTISAN TRAIL

Mr. Tony Williams, Director of Economic Development, said they are asking for support, not funding. Funds will be coming from tourism revenue. Other localities have used this as an economic development tool and partnering with other communities has been discussed. Mr. Williams introduced Ms. Sherri Smith, Executive Director for the Artisan Center of VA.

Ms. Smith said the Artisan Center of VA is the official organization for artisans in the State. The Center is embarking on a mission that centers around building artisan trails in Virginia.

The Artisans Center of Virginia develops and implements systems and strategies to improve economic outcomes for Virginia artisans and their communities while assisting them in promoting their local artisan culture. ACV's Artisan Trail Network offers a unique opportunity

to form strategic alliances with artisans, venues, galleries and retailers, and agri-artisans/agri-tourism businesses across the State, while connecting points of interest, restaurants, and accommodation locations in the related communities in order to enhance regional tourism activity.

Ms. Smith reviewed the brochure, information regarding Artisan Trails and the process of establishing a trail. She noted the community is also involved in this process.

Mr. Peyton asked if a letter of support would be appropriate and Ms. Smith said a letter of support would be appreciated.

Mr. Frydl questioned funding and use of tourism dollars. Mr. Williams noted the plan is to invite Orange and Madison Counties to partner in this project. Funding would be determined by involvement of other communities. Ms. Smith said funding comes from various sources. There is a one year implementation period and the program is designed to be sustainable.

Mr. Deane questioned what route the trail would take in Greene County. Ms. Smith explained that "trail" is used in a very broad sense in that the visitor creates their own trail. The Greene County Trail would be a defined region.

Mr. Lamb noted there were 122,000 hits per month on the Artisan Trail web page. He asked if events in the County could also be included on the web page. Ms. Smith said yes as all participants can utilize the calendar.

Mr. Frydl noted this is part of the role of tourism/economic development. He asked if the Tourism Committee and EDA are in agreement. Mr. Williams said there is support both the Tourism Committee and EDA. This will actually assist him in marketing the County better.

It was the consensus of the Board to draft a letter of support.

RE: VDOT QUARTERLY MEETING

Mr. Joel Denunzio, Acting Residency Administrator, was present to discuss road matters. He reported the following:

- Final round of mowing will begin next week
- Turn lane project on Route 29 is complete
- Mutton Hollow Road Project – completion date of October 26, 2012 – then move forward with Phase II
- Route 607 intersection – anticipated ad date is June, 2014

Mr. Lamb said traffic is backing up on Route 33 east at the intersection with Route 29 (Moore Road). Also, there are three traffic lights for two lanes (heading west) at that intersection. Mr. Denunzio said he would look into these issues.

Mr. Peyton asked if the bridge replacement over Conway River on Route 230 will utilize federal funds. Mr. Denunzio said he would also check on that.

Mr. Frydl said there is a problem with a damaged culvert on Route 743 near Caradon Subdivision. A section of the culvert is jagged and creating a safety issue.

Mr. Frydl also noted there is an ongoing dump site on Welsh Run Road. Both the Sheriff and VDOT are aware of the site. He asked both to keep an eye on the area.

The Chairman opened the floor for public comments.

Daniel Bledsoe – Warmar Road – What needs to be or can be done to get road into VDOT system? There are safety issues on the road. Residents do not own the road nor does the County or VDOT. The County does have the right to take the road. He asked that funding be identified to get the road ready for VDOT to takeover. Maintenance of the road is being paid for

by homeowners. This has been going on for forty years and there should be funds available. Asked if the Board of Supervisors would at least commit to looking for funds.

Mr. Peyton said this is an ongoing dilemma and has been discussed several times. He asked the County Attorney to clarify the process the Board goes through to recommend a road be accepted into the State system and noted he was not aware of any exceptions to this process.

Mr. Clarke said VDOT won't accept a road unless it is built to their standards. The County is not able to adopt roads into the State System that does not meet VDOT standards

Mr. Denunzio reviewed the process to have a road accepted into the State Secondary System. After a road is built, meets service requirements, and a request to accept is received, VDOT does a punch list inspection. Among requirements are quality of construction materials, plats, right-of-way dedicated to public use and as built plans.

Mr. Denunzio said a punch list has been done four or five times since 1974 for Warmar Road. The punch list is given to developer, developer makes correction, VDOT inspects and accepts road. The last punch list for Warmar Road was completed in 2002. The developer was supposed to address items on the list. Current regulations would require the road be bonded with the County and the developer would be responsible for paying for upgrades necessary to have road up to VDOT standards and accepted into system.

Mr. Frydl said the County did not have standards of development in 1974 and did not have bond requirements. He said some roads were built as private roads while others were built with the intention of being accepted into the State system. The developer for this particular road did not do his part and the County, at that time, did not have an enforcement vehicle to make them. Mr. Bledsoe asked how this cycle could be broken and what can be done to get necessary funding to upgrade Warmar Road to correct life safety issues.

Mr. Peyton said the Board will make note of this issue and thanked Mr. Bledsoe and Mr. Denunzio for their comments.

**RE: PUBLIC HEARING – WELL AT RECREATION PARK**

Mr. Bart Svoboda, Zoning Administrator, said this well was drilled for use at the comfort station and is not a community well. The Health Department requires the creation and dedication of a 100 x 100 well lot for final approve. The well lot is then dedicated for public use.

Mr. Clarke, County Attorney, said when the County dedicates the parcel to the public, it is legally transferring the property which requires a public hearing. The Board is considering the adoption of a resolution authorizing the Chairman to sign the deed of dedication.

The Chairman opened the floor for public comment. Mr. James Henshaw questioned what exactly was meant by public. Could he go there and get water to haul away? The Chairman explained this will allow the use of the water fountains at the comfort station.

In response to a question by Mr. Lamb regarding the fencing of the well lot, Mr. Svoboda said it would not be fenced in. He noted there is a 6 x 6 concrete pad poured around the well and the cap is sealed. Mr. Lamb questioned if there would be a safety issue with the well lot not being fenced in.

Upon motion by Davis Lamb and unanimous vote, the Board approved the resolution of dedication as presented. (See Attachment "A")

**RE: HAZARD MITIGATION GRANT PROJECT**

Ms. Melissa McDaniel, Emergency Operations Manager, was present to request permission to apply for a Hazard Mitigation Grant. A local match is required. The opportunity to apply for funds through the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program comes from the Derecho Severe Weather Event on June 29, 2012.

In reviewing the after action report from the Derecho critique, it was determined that we have a multitude of issues with generators around the County and/or facilities that do not have a generator. These issues are in line with the Capital Improvement Plan for FY 12 thru FY 14. The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) will fund up to 75% of eligible costs of the project.

A pre-application was required and was submitted on September 14. The pre-app was a simplistic one page form and could be easily pulled if so desired.

The locations identified for the project included:

- Stanardsville Volunteer Fire Company
- Ruckersville Volunteer Fire Company
- Sheriff’s Department
- Court Complex
- County Building
- Greene County Rescue Squad (add \$45,000)

The total project cost is estimated at \$300,000. The 25% match could be picked up by the State but Ms. McDaniel suggested the Board be prepared to match the full 25%. A regional contact at VDEM indicated the possibility of grant funds for the fire departments stood a good chance.

Mr. Peyton felt there are three generators that are subject to failure at any time. It is extremely important to replace the generator at the Sheriff’s Office which has been in service for a number of years.

Ms. McDaniel said she would like to have a new generator at the Ruckersville Fire Department location also. That location is being considered for use as the backup 911 center and alternate emergency operations center.

Upon motion by David Cox and unanimous vote, the Board authorized the submission of an application for Hazard Mitigation Grant Program funds for the generator project.

Mr. Don Pamenter discussed a memo from JABA questioning the fee required for the construction of a handicap ramp. JABA research shows that Greene has the highest fee (\$175) in the area. JABA is requesting the Board's consideration to exempt handicap ramps from fees.

The Board directed Mr. Svoboda to review the schedule of fees and make recommendation to the Board.

SOCIAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT

Mr. James Howard, Director of Social Services, was present to request authorization to fill a vacant full-time Social Worker position. He anticipates this to be budget positive.

VICTIM WITNESS COORDINATOR

Major Russell Lane and Mr. Ron Morris, Commonwealth Attorney, were present to request authorization to fill the vacant position of Victim Witness Coordinator. This position works part-time in the Sheriff's Office and part-time in the Commonwealth Attorney's Office. Grant funds covers 20 hours, the County covers 10 hours, and the remaining hours are covered by the Commonwealth Attorney's Office.

Mr. Morris suggested the funding arrangement be maintained noting fees collected from fines and costs are paid to the County. This was originally approved for a one year trial and first quarter figures indicate things are on track.

#### HANDICAP RAMPS

Mr. Jimmy Henshaw agreed with the request to lower or exempt handicap ramp fees. He felt there was no need for a \$100 zoning fee as handicap ramps can extend into setbacks. Mr. Henshaw gave an example of the construction of a dog kennel as a project that would not require any fees.

Mr. Henshaw also asked that seating be provided at the podium for individuals who have difficulty standing.

#### STAR

Mr. Roy Dye was present to give a brief update on the streetscape project in Stanardsville. The project has experienced delays but construction should be underway by early spring. STAR is waiting for final approval by VDOT in order to advertise the project.

RE: OTHER MATTERS FROM THE BOARD

HANDICAP RAMPS

Mr. Deane questioned the time required to obtain a permit for a handicap ramp noting some ramps are needed quickly. He said he would be in favor of expediting the process in addition to reducing the applicable fees.

Mr. Peyton asked if metal ramps are considered temporary. Mr. Svoboda said he would need to conduct research and check with the Building Official in regards to permits for handicap ramps.

Mr. Frydl said the fees seem to come directly from the building inspection fee schedule. Mr. Svoboda said there would be a \$100 zoning fee which covers zoning inspection and review of application. The minimum fee for a building permit is \$75.

WMHS GOLF TEAM

Mr. Frydl noted the WMHS Golf Team won the State Championship today.

IT POSITION

Mr. Frydl noted the IT position for the County has been vacant from quite some time. Funding is in the current budget and he feels this area is critical. The School IT Department provides assistance when they are available. The School staff is doing a good job but it is not their main priority nor do they have time to block out specifically for the County. County departments are getting IT assistance as needed and in emergency.

Mr. Frydl said it is important to advertise this position and then figure out, with existing staff, how it would be managed. It could be either a joint venture, with supervision from Schools or independent. The County is now at the size where it makes sense to have its own separate IT department.

Mr. Frydl said he would like the Board to direct staff to begin the process of advertising this position or set aside time to discuss. It is important to begin the process.

Mr. Deane agreed. Mr. Lamb said he liked the idea of a hybrid position. Mr. Frydl agreed that was one option but felt the County needs a dedicated IT staff member. Management of the IT position will be the County Administrator's responsibility.

Mr. Peyton said he would rather find a contractor or retiree to fill this position and the County would not have to pay benefits. He agreed that this needs to be discussed further.



SHERIFF'S OFFICE

Mr. Frydl said the Sheriff had an opportunity to purchase a motorcycle at a discounted cost. Board members agreed that the Sheriff had that ability within his budget. Any additional budget effects would be discussed during the budget process.

Resolution of Dedication

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF GREENE:

I. That the Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes and directs the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors to execute a deed dedicating certain County-owned property located within the County Park, denominated tax parcel 38-A-135, and consisting of .229 acres, more or less, to the public for use as a public water supply, as follows:

WHEREAS, the County has identified a need for access to public water supplies for the health and safety of the citizens of the County; and

WHEREAS, the County has caused a well to be drilled on County property to provide for a public water supply; and

WHEREAS, the Board has held a public hearing on the question of the transfer of property as required by subsection B of the Virginia Code § 15.2-1800, and considered public input on the transfer.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF GREENE:

That pursuant to Virginia Code § 15.2-1800, the Board hereby dedicates the property located within the County Park, denominated as tax parcel 38-A-135, and consisting of .229 acres, more or less, as more fully described by plat of Earl W. Motley, L. S., of record in the Clerk's Office of the Circuit Court of Greene County at plat cards 4636 and 4637, to the public for use as a public water supply; and further,

That the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors is authorized and directed to execute a deed of dedication in accordance with the provisions of this Resolution.

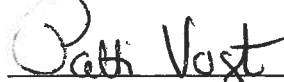
